What is a Preliminary Hearing (PH)?

The Tribunal is aware that some cases can be more complex than others.

This complexity is often reflected in the number of days a case is assigned for the Merits Hearing.

• i.e. the more complex, the more days allocated.

What is a Preliminary Hearing (PH)?

The types of cases that the Tribunal assumes will be more complex are: discrimination claims; and whistleblowing claims.

The Tribunal uses PHs that are referred to as 'Case Management Hearings' to help progress the case. This type of PH will come first in a case.

What is a Preliminary Hearing (PH)?

In order to help everyone prepare better for cases, the Tribunal will assign a PH date at the very outset of the case.

This will be a short procedural hearing of around 1 hour.



What is a Preliminary Hearing?

- Parties and or their representatives will attend the Tribunal to go through an <u>Agenda</u>.
- This can be a telephone conference call or a virtual hearing or a hearing in person.
- The Agenda will have been issued in advance to help everyone prepare for the PH. For more information regarding the agenda please refer to slideshow 4D.



What is a Preliminary Hearing?

A Case Management Preliminary Hearing is a private hearing.

It will only be attended by the relevant parties and or their representatives and the Employment Tribunal Judge.
